A great bowler and proud of the trophies that sit upon his dresser. A man of many talents, like gardening, cooking, and wine making. Anthony was a man who held his family dearest to his heart. As you walk into his home you find it arranged with photos of friends and family. His face would light up each time he spent time with any one of them. In his later years he would take as much time as possible to admire the world from his front yard.
