and you just laughing.

You listened when i cried over boys or work or just little things.  
Sometimes you would give advice othertimes you just said you  
loved me.

You made the best carrot cake and to this day anyone that knows  
me knows it's my favorite cake. I will always remember you when i  
eat it. You could never remember my birthday so you just called the  
day after Papas birthday. At least it was the right month lol. You  
cooked the best food and never sat down till we were all plated and  
almost half way through our first plates. And then you continued to
