Dr. Cathy Donovan, a beloved mother, sister, daughter, aunt, church member, and physician died suddenly and tragically on Monday, November 13, 2023. Cathy was born in St. Petersburg, FL on October 14, 1967 as the youngest of a set of twins. She grew up in Florida, attending the University of Miami where she was a member of the "Band of the Hour" during the peak of the Hurricane football powerhouse. She then attended medical school at the University of North Carolina and did a family medicine residency in Spartanburg, South Carolina. She graduated from residency in 1996 and having fallen in love with both the health system and the community on Mille Lacs Lake, she moved to Minnesota, embracing all that Minnesota's beautiful outdoors has to offer. In 2000, she adopted her dearly loved daughter, Joy Chenghui Xu from Nanjing, China. Cathy embraced her life as a mother with her usual exuberance becoming a Girl Scout leader and school trip chaperone. In 2005 Cathy grew her family with the adoption of Shan Liang Dang from Luoyang, China. With the adoption of Shan, Cathy became an active sports mom and advocate for children with limb differences. Having seen her children grow into successful young adults, she used her free time to enjoy running, particularly with her beloved rescue dogs, most recently Sunny and Flash, and snuggling with her many cats, who would just show up in her life and demand to join her family. A long-time recreational runner, Cathy achieved a personal goal, successfully completing Grandma's Marathon in Duluth in June 2023 with her reluctant twin

sister. Other than running, Cathy was known for her love of travel, having visited 49 states before graduating from high school, her love of gardening, and her adventurous spirit, which resulted in her trying things that at times amused or horrified her family.

Cathy is survived by her beloved children, Joy and Shan; along with her son-in-law, Benedict Behrens, who is more like Cathy in many ways than her own children; her loving parents, George and Shirley Donovan; sisters, Robin Councilman (Dave) and Christy Pemberton (Dennis); nieces and nephews, Dana, Aaron, Kelsey, Amelia, Kyle, and Aiden; aunts and uncles, Joy and Bob Teasley, Eric and Sheree Cunningham, and Larry and Sally Newman and many friends and colleagues.

Cathy was preceded in death by her grandparents, Mattie and George Daughtery and Kelsie and George Donovan, Sr.; and aunt, Patricia Newman.

Her celebration of life will be held on Monday, November 20, 2023, at 1:00 pm at Holy Cross Catholic Church, Onamia, MN with coffee and desserts to follow.

“Cathy, Robin, and I have been best friends – sisters, really – for nearly 40 years. I don’t have the words to express how precious Cathy was to me and how much I admired her. She was such a special person: faithful, playful, kind, adventurous, smart, curious, dependable, funny, humble, practical, exceptionally generous, helpful, and loving (especially loving.) She lived life with love, faith, integrity, enjoyment, and appreciation. She also was an amazingly committed mother, and loved and enjoyed her children so very much. Looking at her impact on others, Cathy reminds me of my grandmother, which is the highest compliment I could pay someone. As for how she impacted me as a friend, Cathy always – always! – offered me such grace, unconditional love, and complete acceptance. We encouraged each other in faith and covered each other and our families in prayer. Despite the many miles and a sea between us these many years, we remained best friends. Usually, I think of her and immediately I smile, my heart warms, and I feel safe.

On Cathy’s and Robin’s recent birthday, I commented how Lauren Daigle’s song about friendship, *Thank God I Do*, reminded me of the friendship between we three. This friendship, as the song says, has been my safe place, my anchor, my constant, my steadiness, my shelter, and “I don’t know who I’d be if I didn’t know you...Thank

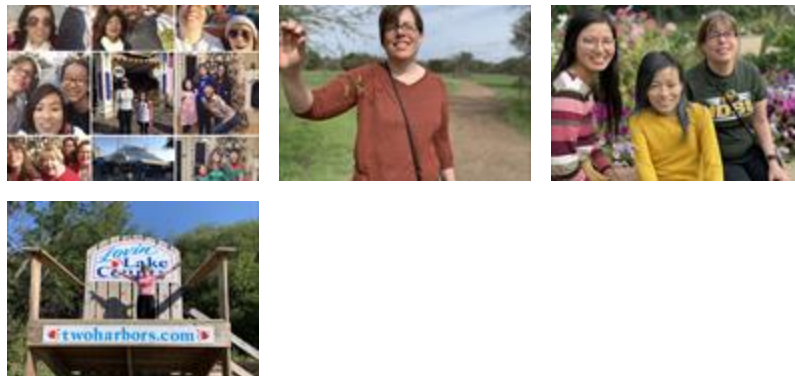

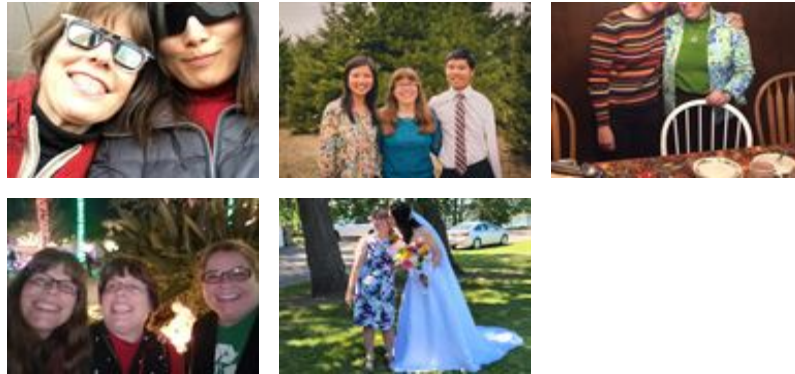

“ I knew Cathy since college days at the University of Miami. Between her and her twin sister Robin, she has always been the quieter of the two. Nonetheless, she has always been socially conscious, dedicated to pursuing a medical career for the sake of addressing the lack of accessible primary healthcare in many communities. She went beyond lip service to her beliefs and lived out her faith diligently, eschewing life in a big city to serving in a rural community where she felt she could have a greater impact.

In her own way, she would show concern for those in need. I was somewhat surprised that she would actively seek to adopt not just one, but two orphans from China. Having to juggle a medical practice as well as being a single mother dealing with a cross-cultural family must have been challenging. Nonetheless, it was very much in character for her, not afraid to take on challenges, irrespective of how daunting they may be.

Unsurprisingly, her caring nature would extend to other living things as well. From macaws to cockatiels, Vietnamese pot bellied pigs to parakeets, she has always had one or more pets in her home. Her love for animals, both typical and atypical, was a big part of her life. They were family as much as the usual suspects were.

Cathy was more than a friend to me; we shared various joys and trials of young adulthood. She embodied the ethos of Steven Curtis Chapman’s song “Kindness,” inspiring me to do more with my life, to “love like we’ve been loved.” She will be sorely missed.
