Clyde J. Schrauth, age 92, of Wahkon, MN, passed away on December 4, 2023, in Duluth, MN. Clyde was born on August 3, 1931, in Wahkon, Minnesota, to Edward and Ivy (Biskey) Schrauth. He grew up on family farms on Hwy 27 and Stevens Road, where he lived most of his life. He attended Wahkon grade school and graduated from Isle High School in 1949, where he played football and was on the championship team his senior year. Clyde had a 1916 Model T roadster in high school and participated in many Isle Days Parades over the years. He was in the Naval Reserves for 8 years. After high school, Clyde worked in the cities for a concrete contractor in Crystal, returning to Wahkon in 1958 to begin his construction company. He built the Messenger building in 1959 and the Isle bowling alley in 1960. Clyde specialized in masonry and was famous for the split field stone fireplaces he constructed throughout the area; he retired in 1992. In his spare time and in retirement, he worked the family farm growing hay and was one of the last sheep farmers in the area. Clyde loved farming and also grew a large garden, eating and preserving natural produce long before the current fad. It was a sad day in 2021 when he sold the farm

after moving into assisted living in Onamia. He enjoyed hunting and fishing with trips to Colorado for many years with his friends to hunt elk. His home was the morning gathering place for coffee with friends.

Clyde was preceded in death by his parents; brother, Robert; and sister-in-law, MaeYvonne.

He is survived by his nephews, David (Syvia) Schrauth and Lynn (Deonne) Schrauth in Salt Lake City; and his niece, Jill (Tom) Virgl in Seattle. Clyde's one regret was not finding a young lady to marry and have a family. A special thanks to his dear friends Jim and Pat Kroll for their help and kindness that allowed Clyde to stay in his home as long as possible.
