During his tenure at Onamia High, he served as track and cross-country coach and later became the school's athletic director until retiring in 1986. In recognition of his many years of service to the school, the OHS football field was named in his honor. George was active in the Onamia community as a member of Holy Cross Church and the Onamia city council. He was an honorary member of the Crosier Alumni Association and held a variety of positions within the Minnesota state high school league at both the conference and district levels. He enjoyed fishing, golfing, playing cards and watching sports of all kinds, especially the Minnesota Twins.
