Henry H. Wehseler, 95 year old resident of Little Falls, MN, formerly of Tofte, MN passed away Monday, October 17, 2016 at St. Otto's Care Center in Little Falls.

A Mass of Christian Burial will be held at 10:30 A.M. on Friday, October 21, 2016 at Our Lady of Lourdes Catholic Church in Little Falls, MN with Father Joe Herzing officiating. Burial will be at Minnesota State Veteran's Cemetery north of Little Falls, MN. Visitation will be from 9:30-10:30 A.M. on Friday at the church. Military Rites will be conducted by the Little Falls American Legion Post #46 and VFW Post #1112.

Henry was born on June 10, 1921 in St. Martin County to the late William & Josephine (Karash) Wehseler. He served in the CC at Beena Camp near Lake Winnibigoshish. He joined the U.S. Navy and served as an aviation machinist in the Solomon Islands during World War II.

He married Florence Kloss on September 6, 1945 at Holy Trinity Catholic Church in Royalton, MN. They lived at Sawbill Landing and later moved to Tofte where they built and operated the North Shore Market & Bottle Shop.

Henry is survived by his wife Florence of 71 years. Sons Richard (Lori) of Duluth, MN, Gary (Cindy) of St. Bonifacius, MN, Bill (Rita) of Tofte, MN; his grandchildren and great-grandchildren.
