Aanakoogaabo, Kenneth Weyaus, Sr. was born on August 5, 1941 to Ole and Jennie (Dorr) Weyaus. He attended and graduated from Onamia High School. On August 5, 1960 in Minneapolis, MN Kenneth enlisted in the United States Army. He specialized in field artillery and was awarded an Expert Rifle Badge. He was honorably discharged from active duty on August 8, 1963 at Fort Campbell, Kentucky. Kenneth worked for the Mille Lacs Band of Ojibwe in Tribal Operations, and the Minnesota Historical Society Indian Museum. He helped form and founded the AM Vets Post #53. Kenneth chaired the pow-wow committee for 20 years. Playing slots, watching TV, and being with family was how Kenneth liked to spend his time. He had a great sense of humor with the ability to make light of serious situations, even during his last days.

Kenneth will be greatly missed by all.
