Lloyd Walter Holst, 92 year old resident of Little Falls passed away peacefully with family present on Monday at St. Gabriel's Hospital in Little Falls. Funeral Services will be held at 11:00 AM on Friday, January 28, 2011 at First Lutheran Church in Little Falls with Rev. David Sperstad officiating. Burial will be at Freedhem Cemetery in Freedhem, MN. Visitation will be from 4 to 7 PM on Thursday at the Shelley Funeral Chapel in Little Falls and one hour prior to the service on Friday at the church.

Lloyd Walter Holst was born on January 5, 1919 in Harding, South Dakota to Walter & Theresa Holst. In his early years, his family moved to the Freedhem area and farmed. On September 21, 1940, he was united in marriage to Lorene Eckwall. They had three children, Janice, Judy and Jerry. Lloyd and Lorene farmed in the Freedhem area for many years. In 1963, he bought into the Allis Chalmers/Jeep dealership in Little Falls. He owned and operated Little Falls Dodge for many years. Lorene passed away on November 13, 1996. In 1997, Lloyd retired from Little Falls Dodge. Lloyd was united in marriage to Elaine Holste on July 24, 1998. He was an avid golfer, hunter and fisherman. He also enjoyed playing the accordion, singing in a quartet, spending time with his family, especially the annual family vacation in Detroit Lakes. Lloyd is survived by his wife, Elaine Holste; daughters, Janice (Jerry) Norberg and Judy (Jim) Kienitz; son, Jerry Holst; brother, Ivan (Evelyn) Holst; 7 grandchildren and 9 great-grandchildren.
