Paul Wagner, 60-year-old resident of Onamia, MN formerly Las Vegas, NV and Vernon Center, MN passed away suddenly and unexpectedly due to a medical emergency on July 17, 2017 in Big Timber, MT, en route to his FEMA deployment in California. A Mass of Christian Burial will be held at 3 P.M. on Monday, July 24, 2017 at Holy Cross Catholic Church in Onamia, MN with Father Jerry Schik, osc officiating. Private interment will in Calvary Cemetery in Mankato, MN. Visitation will be held 2 hrs. prior to Mass at Holy Cross Catholic Church in Onamia, MN.
