



## Raymond Zimmerman

February 6, 1921 - August 28, 2008

Raymond Zimmerman, Sr., was born on February 6, 1921 near Royalton, Minnesota to William and Ethel (Nelson) Zimmerman. On September 14, 1942 Raymond enlisted in the United States Army. He served in WWII in North Africa and on a small island near Sardinia. Raymond received a medal of good conduct, five overseas bars, and the European-African-Middle Eastern Theater service medal. He was Honorably Discharged from active duty on November 1, 1945. When he returned to Minnesota, Raymond performed electrical work for a boiler company in Minneapolis. He was united in marriage to Johanna Rudolph on October 20, 1948 near Randall, Minnesota. The couple operated a Holstein dairy farm and later raised black Angus beef cattle. Raymond enjoyed his many years working for the Isle Co-op. He also worked as a janitor for a public warehouse company in the metro area for several years, later retiring to the farm near Isle.

Raymond is survived by his son, Raymond Zimmerman, Jr., of Isle, MN; daughter, Irene (Michael) Vanderpoel of Oak Grove, MN; brothers, Carl (Jeanne) Zimmerman of Seattle, WA, Allen (Fay) Zimmerman of Wasilla, AK; sisters, Bertha Norby of Winona, MN, Mable (Roy) Lebo of Carlisle, PA, Martha (Glenn) Masden of Walla Walla, WA; sister-in-law, Darlene Zimmerman of Boring, OR.

He was preceded in death by his wife, Johanna Zimmerman; parents, William & Ethel Zimmerman; brother, Arnold Zimmerman.
