February 16, 1925 - August 5, 2019

Reuben F. Weber, 94 year old resident of Little Falls, MN, passed away on Monday, August 5, 2019 at the Veteran's Administration Hospital in St. Cloud, MN. A Funeral Service will be held at 12 noon on Thursday, August 8, 2019 at Zion Lutheran Church in Little Falls, with Rev. Gary Hendrickson officiating. Burial will be at 2 PM on Thursday at the Minnesota State Veteran's Cemetery north of Little Falls. Visitation will be from 11 AM until 12 noon Thursday at the church. Honors will be provided by Little Falls V.F.W. #1112 and Little Falls American Legion #46.

Reuben Frederick Weber was born on February 16, 1925 in Hillsboro, ND to the late William & Della (Rust) Weber. Reuben served in the United States Army during WWII. He was captured by the German Army and was marched by foot through France to Stalag 2A in Brandenburg, Germany. He escaped from this internment but was recaptured and sent to a Russian Prisoner of War Camp, from which he was eventually liberated by the Russian Army. Reuben was a "survivor" and a true patriot and hero for his country. During the most difficult times, he turned to prayer, trusting in his Lord and Savior to see him through.

Reuben was a devoted husband and father, well respected Boy Scout Leader and an avid fisherman. He had a strong faith and was active in choir and Bible study at Zion Lutheran Church in Little Falls.

Reuben is survived by his loving wife of 72 years, Adeline; sons, William (Bernita) Weber and Robert (Lois) Weber; grandchildren, Christine Weber and Ryan Weber; great-grandson, Jackson Dimmick.

Reuben was preceded in death by his parents, William & Della Weber; brothers, Walter, Eddie and Lloyd Weber; step-son, Clif Weber and cousin, Earl Weber.
