Stan really enjoyed doing things like making horseradish and grape jelly. He loved having family get together and never let anyone forget that it was his Birthday and how he liked getting presents. His sense of humor and joking around will never be forgotten by those who knew him.

For the last year Stan attended the Buffalo Adult Day Center where he did many activities and made a lot of new friends, he especially liked the staff as they made him feel very comfortable in his new surroundings.
